Mr. Frazer graduated from the University of Texas in 1973 with a BBA in Accounting. He has been a CPA since 1975.

He joined the audit staff of Ernst & Ernst (now Ernst & Young) upon college graduation where he served clients in the petroleum and oil field supply industries for five years. During the next eight years he served as vice president and controller of several closely held oil field companies in the Houston area, including Wilson Supply Division, one of the nation's largest oil field supply companies.

Mr. Frazer was employed with CBRE Capital Markets Debt & Equity Finance (then L.J. Melody & Company) from 1986 through May, 2012 when he retired to focus on giving back to his community. He served as CFO of CBRE Capital Markets and was responsible for all financial accounting, financial reporting and income tax functions, all loan servicing and asset management functions for Capital Markets multi-billion dollar portfolio, managing and coordinating all banking relationships for escrow and reserve accounts associated with the serviced loans, managing and coordinating warehouse lines of credit, and the coordination of all data processing functions.

During his career, in addition to his financial management experience, Mr. Frazer has also been responsible for all aspects of corporate operations including personnel, regulatory and licensing matters, employee benefits and all other administrative functions. As controller and CFO for a variety of closely held companies, Mr. Frazer has gained valuable experience in all aspects of the corporate environment.

Mr. Frazer is a past President of the Houston CPA Society and has served on the Board of Directors of the Texas Society of CPAs for the past 22 years. The Houston and Texas CPA Societies are engaged in many civic and educational programs to improve the lives and education of others. Mr. Frazer has been an active participant in Houston CPA Society's scholarship programs and is a member of its Scholarship Endowment Committee.

Mr. Frazer is also involved in his church and his community. He is a member of St. Martin's Episcopal Church and has served on its Vestry and is currently a member of its Senior Council.
