*Virtually everyone is unhappy with their body. You're normal.

*Autism is the most commonly held trait among children today who are transitioning.

"I developed a sort of hate for women (now I'm in a foster home and I've begun to deal with that hate.)

*Kids in state care are WAY over-represented statistically in the numbers of kids transitioning.

These kids have been abused, neglected, and have trauma.

So what does the state do? They transition them, no questions asked. It's disgusting.

"I've made my FTM coming out at school, and some teacher (that I'll sure have next year) calls me by my masculine name, and IDK how to tell them "Hey I don't think I'm trans, sorry!" (My art teacher will be supportive, I know that.)"

"I'm also worried because I talked about it to some friends who reject me because of that. Furthermore, my high school is a progressive pro-trans school, and that's pretty cool except that when someone detransitions they start to hate them."

"One of my friends has a rumor about him detransitioning, and he lost his friends and all of his class started to bully him."

This thread is a classic case of what a so-called 'trans kid' is and how they are treated.

This 'trans kid' is just a girl. A girl who is struggling and needs help. Instead, the entire culture is pushing her to be trans.

She came out as trans socially at school and now doesn't know how to say she's not, because it will disappoint people, including a teacher, and she'll get hate.

We always hear how oppressed trans people are. Nonsense. It's uncool to be vanilla, straight, and boring.

Like all cults, they are love-bombed when they are trans, and then vilified when they leave the cult.

Nothing in this is about helping a child to be 'who they really are.' If it was, they would be celebrated when they discover they're really not trans. Instead, they are bullied.

These are the children who are declaring they are trans.

They're just kids who for whatever reason are not thriving.

And what do our gender clinics do to these kids on their first or second appointments? Give them drugs and hormones to permanently damage their bodies.

Surgeons are also cutting off the breasts of children. Autistic girls getting maimed and sterilized.

This is raging, off-the-charts child abuse, and I'm not going to rest a day until we've all woken up and collectively put a stop to it.

I'm going to keep heading out to the streets having one conversation at a time.

The vast majority of the population has no idea what is going on, and they aren't going to find out until they run into someone like me.


I'm heading to DC and NYC this week, where I'll be having peaceful conversations during Pride weekend, which has turned into a celebration of child harm.

Historically, gender dysphoria was extremely rare, affecting one child out of several thousand.

As we see in this study, 87.8% grew out of it when they went through puberty, and the majority grew up to be gay.

That is true, historically, but what's happening today is totally different.

This is a craze that has seen a 5000% increase in girls transitioning, in a few short years.

Most are on the autism spectrum. Most are not going to grow up to be gay. Some, yes, but this situation has evolved and our understanding needs to evolve.

The kids most at risk today are children who are neuro-divergent.

They are also kids who are having a rough time in life for some reason, and the culture is pushing this on them.

Social media is really pushing this on them.

There is no such thing as a trans child.

There are a very small number of children with gender dysphoria, and there are hundreds of thousands caught up in a craze.

That's all this is. It's escapism from the angst of adolescence, and it's celebrated. It's a social contagion.

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
